

Student Information – Civilian Clothes Policy

NAPS students will be in uniform or command issued attire much of the time. When students are authorized to wear civilian attire, it must be appropriate for the conservative, professional look of an aspiring officer. Clothing shall be neat, clean, in good repair, and should not create a distraction.

a. Examples of inappropriate clothes include, but are not limited to:

- ripped jeans
- half shirts, belly shirts (shirts that show any skin on stomach)
- short shorts
- undergarments showing (including undershirts and undershirt 'tails')
- shirts with profanity, suggestive material, or advocating drugs or alcohol
- exposed bra/bra straps

b. Uniform items and civilian clothes may not be worn together, except for the following items: undergarments, socks, gloves, shoes, boots, and all-weather(rain) coat.

c. Belts will be worn with pants and shorts that have belt loops. Shirts must be tucked in. Hats may only be worn outside. Shoes must be in good repair and fastened. Shoelaces must be tied.

d. Issued physical training gear and athletic attire are not authorized for off-base liberty unless conducting physical training.
